## First Fresbyterian Church's 180th Lounders' Day

Over one hundred eighty years ago, several settlers in the Pataskala area met in Joseph Baird's barn along Creek Road and discussed the need for a church in the area. Thus was the seed sown for the First Presbyterian Church of Pataskala in 1837. The church was officially organized on November 11, 1837, in old Lima Township.
