UPDATE ON SYDNEY: She had her brain aneurysm surgery on Tues., Jan. 22nd. The Surgery went well, with only a minor set-back the following day with a post-operative, low-grade fever and headache. As this insert is being written, she is doing much better. However, there are future obstacles, as this was an experimental surgery for a child. It has only been done on Adults, as only 3% of children in the U.S. have brain aneurysms. Her surgery was a tunneling surgery that happened through the groin. Because it's considered experimental, insurance will not cover the cost. She will go back in 6 months to see if it has worked, plus a change in life-style and have to take blood-thinners for the rest of her life. Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?

Elders and Deacons answer: I do and I will.

Will you fulfill your office in obedience to Jesus Christ, under the authority of Scripture and be continually guided by the confessions?

Elders and Deacons answer: I will.

Will you be governed by the church's polity and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?

Elders and Deacons answer: I will.

Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Elders and Deacons answer: I will.

Do you promise to further the peace, unity and purity of the church?

Elders and Deacons answer: I do.

Will you seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination and love?

Elders and Deacons answer: I will.

(To Elders) Will you be a faithful Elder, watching over the people, providing for their worship, nurture and service? Will you share in government and discipline, serving in governing bodies of the church, and in your ministry, will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

Elders answer: I will.

(To Deacons) Will you be a faithful deacon, teaching charity, urging concern, and directing the people's help to the friendless and those in need, and in your ministry, will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?
