

#### COMMUNION AND SPECIAL WORSHIP SERVICES

October 6<sup>th</sup>, today, is World Communion Sunday. The tradition was begun in 1933 by Hugh Thomson Kerr who ministered in the Shadyside Presbyterian Church. According to Presbyterian Outlook: "Davitt S. Bell (the late Clerk of Session and church historian at Shadyside) recalled that Dr. Kerr first conceived the notion of World Communion Sunday during his year as moderator of the General Assembly (1930). Dr. Kerr's younger son, the Rev. Dr. Donald Craig Kerr, who is pastor emeritus of the Roland Park Presbyterian Church in Baltimore, was sixteen in 1933. He has related that World Communion Sunday grew out of the Division of Stewardship at Shadyside. It was their attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected one with another." It was then adopted throughout the US Presbyterian Church in 1936 and subsequently spread to other denominations.

The concept of World Communion also came about in the era of the Great Depression beginning in 1929. This time was one of economic strife and high employment. Food riots began in February of 1931. Soup and bread lines were long. This time gave birth to church potlucks and popularized casseroles to stretch food! In 1940 after the Great Depression ended, the Federal Council of Churches (now the National Council of Churches), led by Jesse Moren Bader, endorsed World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to Christian churches worldwide.

The sacrament of communion is traditionally shared on Holy or Feast Days found on the liturgical calendar. Holy Days celebrate the anniversary dates of historical and theological significance, derived from Scripture. Though FPC typically offers communion on the 1st Sunday each month, now some of these Holy Days are selected, as explained below.

November 24<sup>th</sup> is the next date selected for communion at FPC following world communion Sunday in October. Although communion has been typically celebrated on the first Sunday of the month, such is often not the case when we celebrate Founder's Day. The 24<sup>th</sup> is now selected as an alternative communion Sunday in November, which precedes Thanksgiving, a national holiday when people gather around the table to give thanks, just as we do at communion! In fact, the Greek word for Thanksgiving is a word that we use for communion:

EVCHARISTO or Eucharist! Also, November 24<sup>th</sup> is Christ the King Sunday, a holy day on the liturgical calendar, celebrating Christ as Our King and Lord, which immediately precedes the season of Advent,

Since communion will have just occurred on November 24<sup>th</sup> and Advent is traditionally a period of fasting and preparation for the church, communion will not occur during Advent in December.

December 24<sup>th</sup> is Christmas Eve. Although we do not share the Lord's Supper, we gather together in community for special worship at 7pm, celebrating the anniversary of the birth of God incarnate in the Christ child, who came as The Light into this world of darkness. That night we signify our joining with him spreading the faith, by lighting candles and singing "Silent Night" and hearing the account of his birth.

**January 5**<sup>th</sup> is the Holy Day of Epiphany, when we hear the Biblical account of the Magi bringing gifts to the Christ child. It is also the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of the new calendar year, when we celebrate anew the gift of the Christ child to us, fellow children and heirs in the kingdom!

February 23<sup>rd</sup> is the Holy Day of Transfiguration Sunday, when we hear the Biblical account of how Jesus reflected the glory of the Father in the presence of Peter, James, and John, along with Moses and Elijah. This Holy Day immediately precedes Lent, which like Advent is a period of fasting and preparation.

February 26<sup>th</sup> is special worship at 7pm on Ash Wednesday, when we literally mark with ashes the beginning of a period of preparation. During Lent, we pray and ready ourselves to remember the final events of Jesus' life on earth as Lord and Savior: his Last Passover Supper and death upon the cross to save us from our sin.

Since the season of Lent is traditionally and liturgically a period of fasting and preparation for the church, communion will not occur during Lent in March.

April 9<sup>th</sup> is the Holy Day of Maundy Thursday, the anniversary of Jesus' last Passover supper before his death the next day, referred to as Good Friday. In remembrance of him, like he instructed his disciples at the Last Supper, we gather as his disciples at the Lord's Table for worship at 7pm and hear of this Biblical account.
