SERMON: "In Taxing Times, Follow Jesus" by The Reverend Dr. Janet Hufford Matthew 9:1-8 and 9-13: Before crossing the Sea of Galilee to show his authority in healings there, in his own town Jesus healed another paralyzed man, the servant of the centurion. But the difference in this passage is that the man is paralyzed because of his sins. Sin does that. Sin paralyzes our lives, keeping us stuck in unhealthy living. But in taxing times, we need to follow Jesus, pun intended. This also the case of Matthew, the tax collector, who is also paralyzed by sin. The pharisees allude to it, when they categorize tax collectors with sinners, both with whom Jesus eats. Jesus does not deny it. He admits that he comes to heal the sick, to heal sinners. Because Matthew got up and followed Jesus, he recognizes his need. The Pharisees, however, do not realize their need to be healed from their sin. The see themselves as righteous. That's a problem, because elsewhere in Scripture it is clearly taught that we are only made righteous through Christ's righteousness. So the end of the passages move from Jesus' healing of the paralyzed man & calling of Matthew (a spiritually paralyzed man), to Jesus' attempting to teach the Pharisees.

But with their rejection, go now to Matthew 9:35-36: In these two verses, Jesus again heals, preaches, and teaches to show forth the Kingdom of God. One thing he teaches his disciples out of compassion in verse 36 is that the crowds are "harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd." Jesus came to the lost sheep of Israel, including his own religious leaders, Pharisee and teachers of the law, for example, but they do not heed him as teacher. They do not see the

Kingdom. Jesus, therefore, instructs his disciples, those who follow him, including the lowly fishermen, who he first called before the sermon on the mount, and now Matthew, a sinner: Matthew 9:37: "Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few." Jesus' words are relevant now, in this time of COVID-19, there are many who are harassed and helpless, like a sheep without a shepherd," therefore, the harvest is plentiful. However, the workers are few, so prayer is necessary.

Matthew 9:38: "Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." Now after preaching and healing, Jesus extends the call to the very disciples who pray for workers.

Matthew 10:1-4: The disciples are the workers, and their ranks have grown beyond the fishermen and Matthew. Then Jesus again teaches.

Matthew 10:5-10: Note Jesus' instructs not to take gold or silver or copper on the call, a reminder of Matthew's likely sin before his call, because tax collectors where known to skim money from the collections. But the main point is the need to trust God to provide for our keep. And with that Jesus finishes his teaching with an instruction of discernment.

Mt 10:11-13: Discernment is to seek out welcoming people & places, who extend peace. The call to proclaim the Good News of the kingdom does not entail force. The message is offered with love (compassion), joy (Good news), and peace. Whether people except the message is not the point. The point is that we as workers need to extend the message of kingdom, to share, to plant the seed. And today we have the celebration of installing workers for the harvest, the ruling elders and deacons in the class of 2033, officers elected by you at FPCP.
