Brief Meditation

There is a church traditionally believed to be the site where baby Jesus lived with Mary and Joseph during their stay in Bethlehem. It is said to be the place where the Magi visited them, bringing gifts of incense, gold and myrrh.



This stained-glass window in the church shows the Magi from the east in reverent worship at the feet of the Christ child. Eastern Christian churches celebrate Christmas on the anniversary of the visit of the Magi to see Jesus in Bethlehem.

Pause in silent meditation of remembrance.



This is the doorway to enter the church of the basilica in Bethlehem.
Note how the door is small entrance below the bigger door now bricked in.

This is so that those who enter must bow in reverence to Jesus.

Pause in silent meditation, bowing if willing and able.



This above photo is taken within the church.
The star represents that of the star of Bethlehem that shined where Jesus lay.

It is enshrined under an altar and is surrounded by many lights.

Beneath the marble floor is the place that tradition says is where baby Jesus lay.

There is a hole in the center where one can reach in to touch the place where Jesus lay.

In order to reach, one must kneel, just as did the Magi in reverence.

Pause in silent meditation, bowing if willing and able.

Now let us bow our hearts as we pray as Jesus taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.

Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

**Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors;
and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.**

For thine is the kingdom and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.
