# **Scripture Readings: Ephesians 6:10-13**

**SERMON:** "Armor of God" by The Reverend Dr. Janet Hufford

Here at the end of chapter 6 we come into the final movement of Paul's letter to the Ephesians. The passage starts in v. 10 with imperative commands: "be strong in the Lord" and "put on the full armor of God." Putting on the full armor of God is the means by which God protects his family whom he loves. The home security system is fully armed and engaged through the Lord's mighty power! No ground will be taken, when we stand firm.

When we think of armor, we may also think of the protective gear of athletes like football or hockey players or catchers in baseball. Or even more of the clunky, heavy apparel of medieval knights. While a suit of armor offers a measure of protection against the weapons of a foe, the suit limits vision and mobility, making the one who wears it clumsy and vulnerable in other ways. In addition, armor has chinks, which are vulnerable, weak or exposed gaps that can be penetrated. For example, Goliath the Philistine giant likely wore armor in his battles against the Israelites. However, while wearing no armor since King Saul's armor did not fit properly, David was agile and able to sling rocks into the chink of Goliath's armor to hit him between the eyes and kill him dead. So perhaps our supernatural armor of protection is different than the clunky, heavy suits of armor worn by medieval knights.

Since Scripture interprets Scripture, consider how previously in chapter 5 Paul spoke of our need to take off any covering of darkness and to instead don the light of Christ. We also heard how at his transfiguration, Jesus reflected the glory of the Father for his disciples to see on the mount. So it is with the armor of God. Our supernatural armor that protects us within God's family is composed of light. Armor of light is supported in other various biblical passages, when agents of God appear in bright arraignment, for example, Jesus, angels and even fellow humans.

Hear again of Jesus' appearance at his transfiguration in Mark 9:2-3: After six days Jesus took Peter, James and John with him and led them up a high mountain, where they were all alone. There he was transfigured before them. His clothes became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them.

God's revelation to John while exiled on Patmos also describes Jesus in heaven. Revelation 4:2-3: At once I was in the Spirit, and there before me was a throne in heaven with someone sitting on it. And the one who sat there had the appearance of jasper and ruby. A rainbow that shone like an emerald encircled the throne.

Likewise consider Jesus' appearance from heaven to Paul on the road to Damascus. Act 9:3:4: As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him.

The apostle John begins his gospel in referring to Jesus as The Light. He writes of Jesus in: John 1:4-9: In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. There was man sent from God whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify concerning the light, so that through him all might believe. He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light. The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world.

John reiterates in 1John 1:5-7 This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all.

And even those angels who worship God in shining glory on the throne in the highest heaven are sometimes described as reflecting his light in their appearances on earth.

At his birth: Luke 2:9. An angel of the Lord appeared to the, and the glory of the Lord shone around them...

At his resurrection: Matthew 28:2-3: There was a violent earthquake, for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and, going to the tomb, rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow.

And even faithful human followers of God have been described similarly. There is Moses in Exodus 34:29: When Moses came down from Mount Sinai with the two tablets of the covenant law in his hands, he was not aware that his face was radiant because he had spoken with the Lord.

The armor of God is not dull and tarnished, but shiny and bright to protect us against the forces of darkness. For light in penetrating darkness causes the darkness to retreat and fall back. Darkness cannot withstand light. Darkness cannot overcome light, but light overcomes darkness. Art display: study of darkness.

Donned with the armor of God we are able to stand against the power of this dark world.

Dressed in the armor of God, we are able to stand our ground. For we stand on the foundation of Christ Jesus himself.

Now we conclude where we began from...
